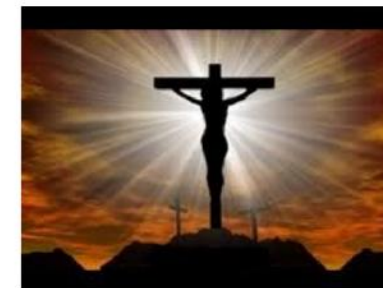
Love of Dear Ones

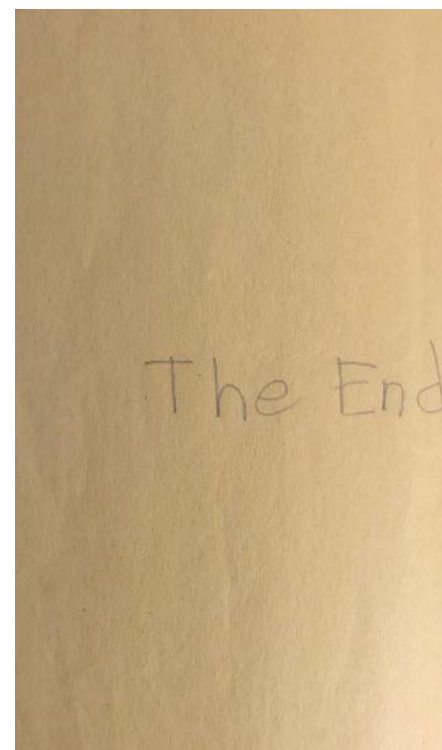
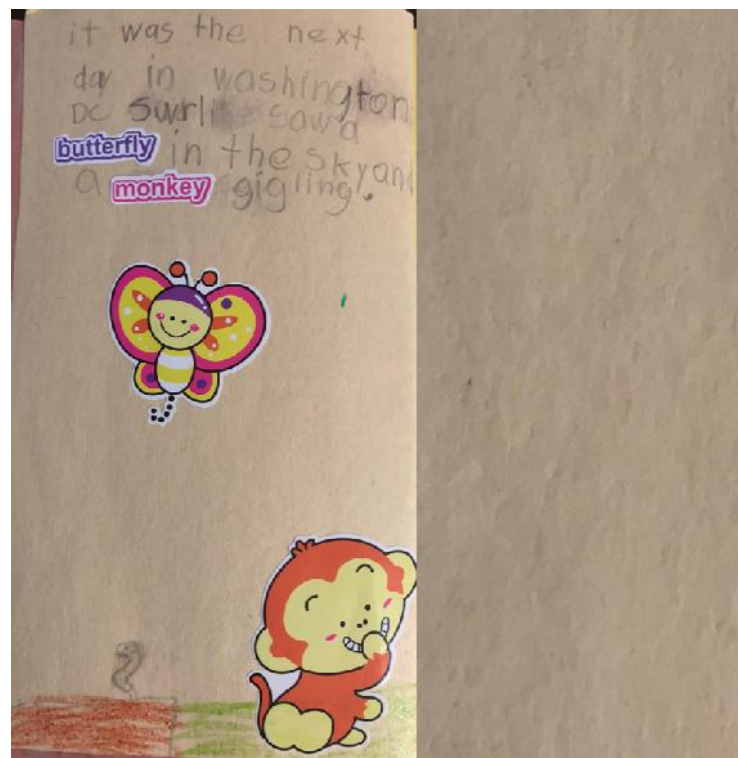
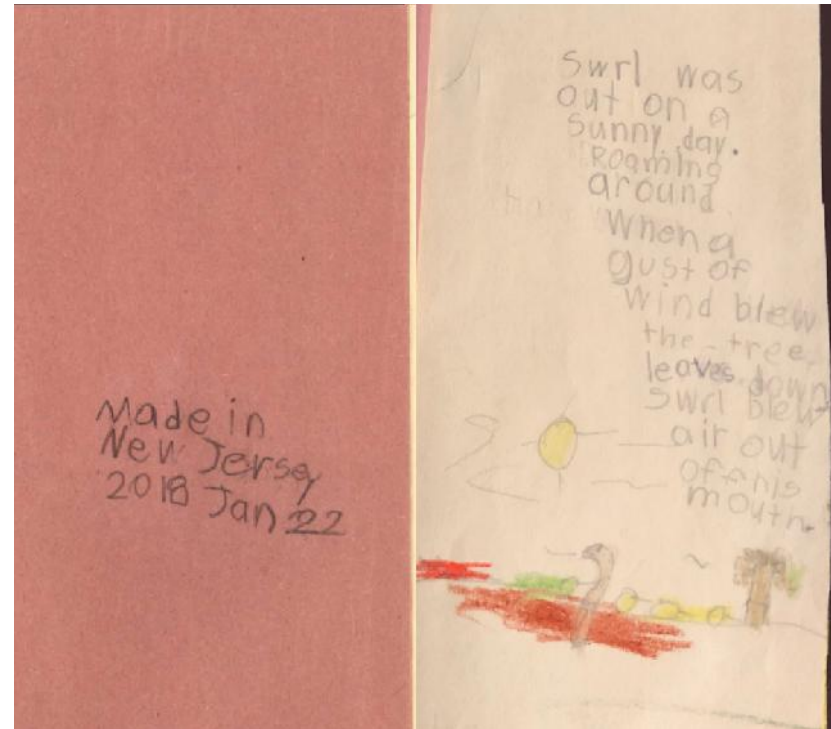

What is your pet's favorite thing to do?

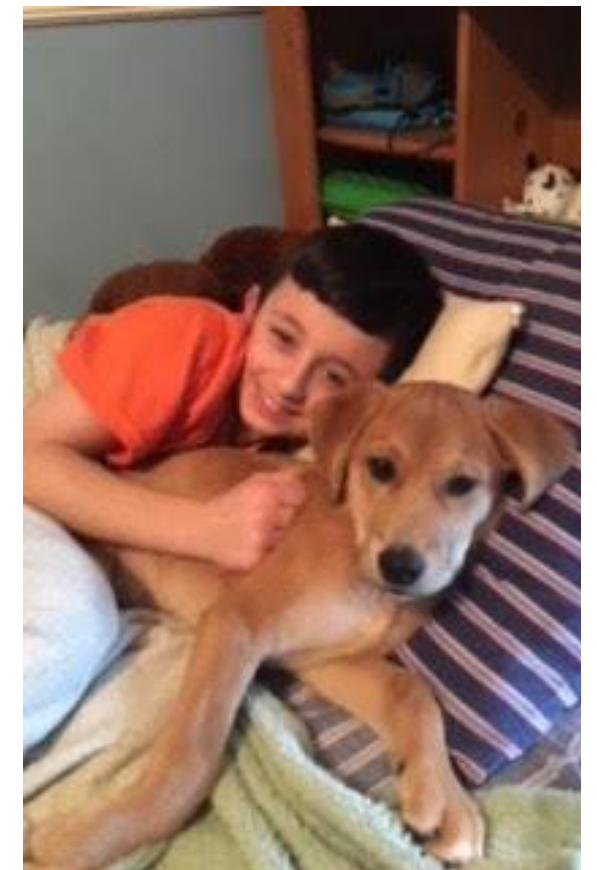

Sometimes he hangs out on my lap and sometimes he hangs out in a hamster ball.

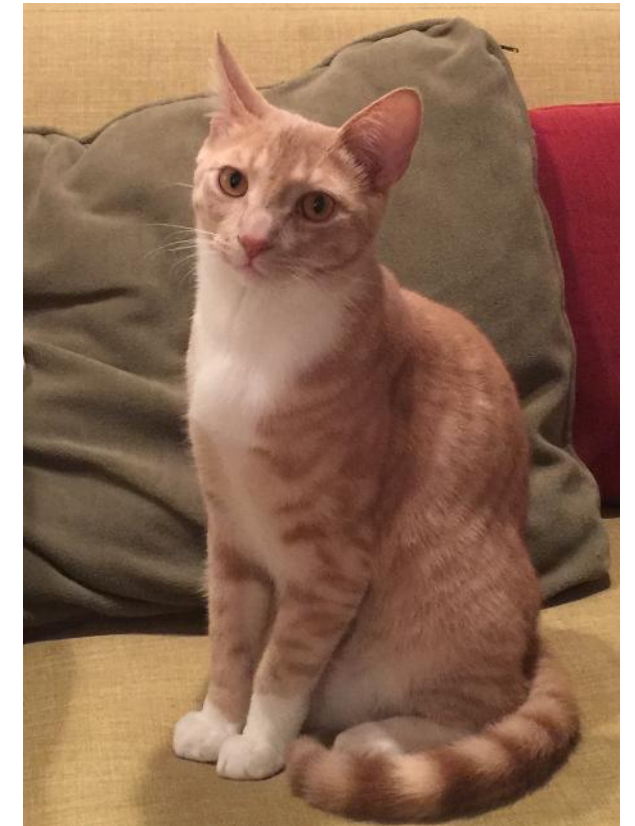
